Nebuchadnezzar's Testimony

Daniel Ch. 4

- Chapter 4 comes towards the end of Nebuchadnezzar's life. Daniel has recorded an official Babylonian document recording the conversion experience of Nebuchadnezzar, who was one of the cruelest monarchs of history. The king will tell us what God did in his life. He gives evidence in his testimony that he had experienced conversion. Here is the account of a man who came to know God in a personal way, and who was so thrilled about it that he not only wrote his personal testimony but instructed that it be sent out to all the nations of the known world.
- God will warn him through a dream what he will suffer because of his pride. He will become completely lost, his mind will go from him. He will be as an animal. After he was recovered from his madness, he will broadcast the his miracle to distant places, and will write down for future ages, **how God had justly humbled and graciously restored him.**

THE WARNING DREAM

Dan 4:4-5 KJV I Nebuchadnezzar was at rest in mine house, and flourishing in my palace: (5) I saw a dream which made me afraid, and the thoughts upon my bed and the visions of my head troubled me.

Before God sends judgment to a man's life he will send him a warning, if man heeds the warning

God will quite often cancel or delay the judgment. God will not be the silent partner in a man's

sins. By remaining silent God would be a partner in man's fall, therefore he warns

Nebuchadnezzar of what will happen to him if he does not humble himself.

(7) Then came in the magicians, the astrologers, the Chaldeans, and the soothsayers: and I told the dream before them; but they did not make known unto me the interpretation thereof.
